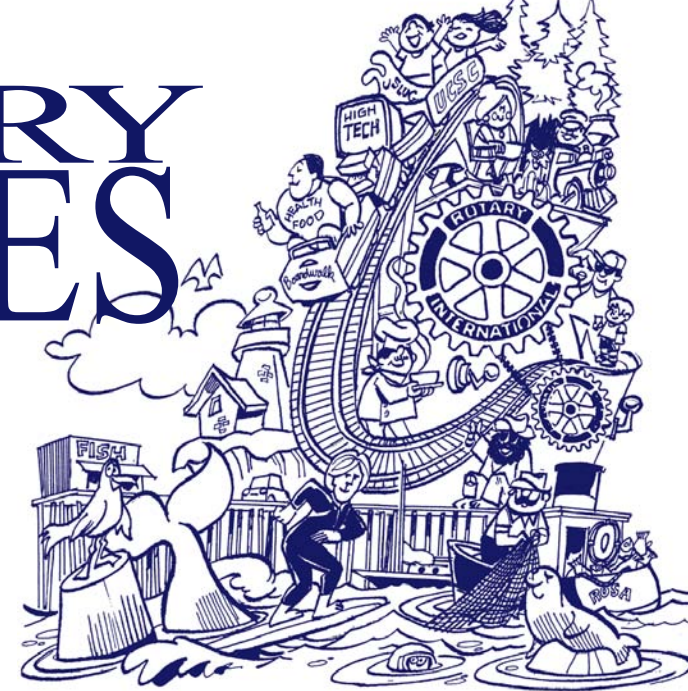

Tom Foster brought a guest, nephew Craig Foster. There are Foster children everywhere. **Sam Bishop** promised to give the door prize to Phyllis, the bar hostess, if Sam won; sooo, Sam presented Phyllis with a nice "share the pot" cash prize. The amount was undetermined.

Charles Eldridge gave a report on the



Vocational Education portion of our Endowment. \$11,500 was given out to 17 students studying for a variety of skills. **Brian King** was given \$7,000 and the County ROP program was given \$3,000. Recipient in music winner, Jason Bond gave a brief thank you to the club. The students will take classes in nursing, Culinary Arts, Radiology Technology, music, Medical assisting, Dental Assisting, and Emergency training.



Dan Aldrich began the presentation of

awards with a short history of the endowment. \$41,000 was given out, with \$14,000 in the form of renewals from the previous year. There were 10 from Santa Cruz High School, 3 from Harbor, 1 from Delta, 1 from Pacific Collegiate, and 1 from Costanoa. They are an especially bright group with a combined GPA of 4.20 and excellent SAT scores. One student scored 2270 SAT. 4 are going to Berkeley, 2 to Cabrillo, 2 to Davis, 1 to Stanford, 1 to Vassar, 1 to UCSC, 1 to Santa Barbara, 1 to Columbia, 1 to UCLA, 1 to Willamette U. and 1 to Scripps. There are 11 "Named" scholarships. Shaffer, Bliss, Sandman, Penniman, Biondi, Canepa, Lynch, Stagnaro, Patterson, Bellas, and McKenzie. Aldrich gave a brief biography of each of the winners. He was very gracious and flattering to each of the recipients. He introduced the parents in attendance as well as some teachers and councillors. The event was beautifully presented. The parents and students expressed their appreciation with loud applause.
