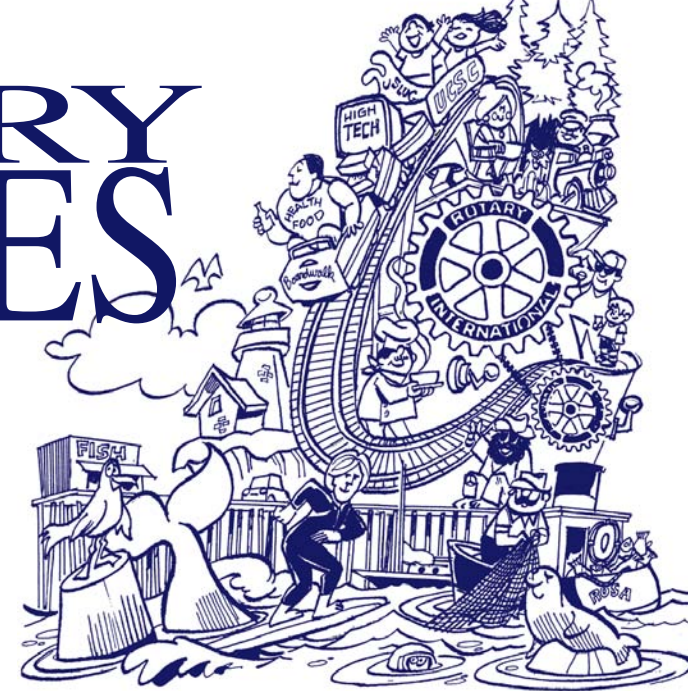

This month is The Rotary Foundation Month, and Russ Hobbs will be sharing with us the history of The Rotary Foundation going back to 1917 when the sixth President of Rotary International (Arch C. Klumph) got the idea to start an Endowment to "do good in the world". Russ will explain the programs that have evolved like The Ambassadorial Scholar Program, Group Study Exchange Program, Matching Grant Program and Polio Program, and will give examples of how Santa Cruz Rotarians have been involved in each one. To-day there are 1.2 million Rotarians in 33,000 Clubs in 200 Countries, and all the Clubs of the world give to The Rotary Foundation. To date, Rotarians have contributed more than \$1.4 billion to the Foundation which last year received \$100 million in contributions and presented the 1,000,000th Paul Harris Fellow award.

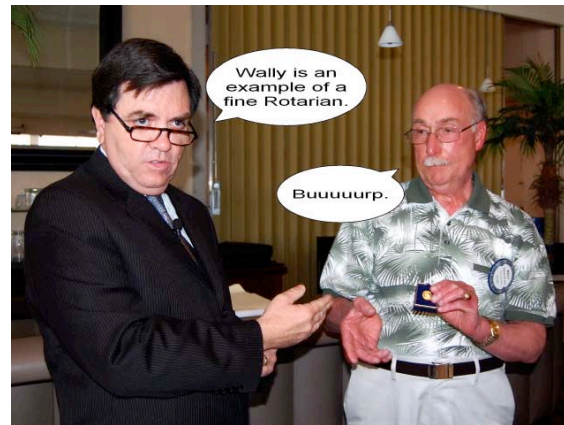
